REQUIREMENTS:

- All entries exhibited must be from the current year's crop and from the exhibitor's own garden or field
- The number, weight or volume of specimens to be exhibited is listed within each lot description or within the individual class requirements
- Vegetable exhibitors are limited to listing no more than 10 vegetables on the fair entry form, plus one Garden Box entry

REQUIREMENTS for CLASS A - I:

- Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified
- Fruits and vegetables need to be cleaned but not washed

REQUIREMENTS: Include a 3" x 5" index card of the variety name with the entry if 'labeled' is listed as a requirement of the entry

CLASS B – FRUITS

REQUIREMENTS: Include a 3" x 5" index card of the variety name with the entry

Lot Numbers:

1. Pears, any variety, correctly labeled - (6)
2. Peaches, any variety, correctly labeled - (6)
3. Plums, any variety, correctly labeled - (12)
4. Nuts, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
5. Grapes, any variety, correctly labeled - 1 bunch
6. Blueberries, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
7. Raspberries, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
8. Blackberries, any domesticated variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
9. Any other fruit (non-apple), correctly labeled (large fruit - 6 each; small fruit - ½ pint)

CLASS C – HERBS

REQUIREMENTS:

- **Individual Herb Entries (Lots 1-12):** Must include (6) sprigs (leaves & stems) in a plastic bag, no roots
- **Herb Display Entry (Lot 13):** Must consist of 5-7 sprigs of any three (3) varieties of herbs, no roots, each herb variety must be tied in a bunch. Include a 3" x 5" index card listing the three (3) herb varieties used in the exhibit

CLASS D – VEGETABLE SCULPTURE

REQUIREMENTS:

- Only plant material may be used to create exhibit. No artificial or non-organic materials
- Toothpicks are allowed for building/stabilization purposes only
- Item must be three dimensional
- Exhibit may represent a human, animal or inanimate objects (airplane, tractor, robot, etc.)

Lot Numbers:

1. Small exhibit: less than 8" at the widest and/or tallest point
2. Large exhibit: more than 8", but less than 16" at the widest and/or tallest point

CLASS E – LARGEST VEGETABLE

Premium - \$5.00, one award per lot

The largest exhibit in each entry will be determined by weight, unless noted.

CLASS G – APPLE VARIETY

REQUIREMENTS:

- All entries in this class must contain one (1) apple type/color with (5) different varieties.
- Entry must include a 3" x 5" index card with the variety names listed

Lot Numbers:

1. Red Apples, identify five (5) different varieties within the exhibit
2. Green or Yellow Apples, identify five (5) different varieties within the exhibit

CLASS H – GARDEN BOX

Entries will consist of a collection of vegetable varieties from the following list:

REQUIREMENTS: All entries in this class must contain six (6) specimens

CLASS J – SMALL GRAINS

REQUIREMENTS:

- Small grain exhibits must be placed in a completely filled (approximately 4 quarts), one-gallon sized clear zipper seal bag. Bag must be labeled with variety
- Small grain sheaves should be 3" to 4" in diameter, dried, cured and labeled with variety on a 3" x 5" index card

2. Oats, 4 quarts, identify variety
3. Wheat, 4 quarts, identify variety
4. Rye, 4 quarts, identify variety
5. Any other small grain not listed, 4 quarts, identify variety

8. Wheat, sheaf, identify variety
9. Rye, sheaf, identify variety
10. Any other small grain not listed, sheaf, identify variety

CLASS K – CORN

REQUIREMENTS: Include a 3" x 5" index card with hybrid and maturity listed

Lot Numbers:

1. Corn, 5 ears, husked, labeled with hybrid and maturity
2. Corn, 3 stalks, tied, roots placed in plastic bag, labeled with hybrid and maturity

CLASS L – SOYBEANS

Lot Numbers:

1. Soybeans, grain, from previous year. Must be placed in a completely filled (approximately 4 quarts), one-gallon sized clear zipper seal bag. Bag must be labeled with variety
2. Soybeans, sheaf, 2½" - 3" diameter at neck, freshly cut, identify variety on a 3" x 5" index card

CLASS M – FORAGE

REQUIREMENTS:

- Hay must be thoroughly cured and haylage must be fermented
- Dry hay exhibits should be a 4" thick slice from a small square bale or equivalent amount cut from large round or square bale and placed in a clear plastic bag

- Haylage and silage exhibits must be placed in a completely filled (approximately 4 quarts), one-gallon sized clear zipper seal bag and labeled with variety
- Corn silage may be from previous falls' harvest

Lot Numbers:

1. Baled first crop hay, 75% or more legume
2. Baled second or subsequent crop hay, 75% or more legume
3. Haylage, first crop, 75% or more legume
4. Haylage, second crop
5. Haylage, third crop
6. Corn silage, can be from previous year
