### ADDITIONAL RULES OF ENTRY

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in a 4H, FFA, or other approved youth group carrying a similar supervised program in Creative Writing, Fiber & Textile Arts, Folk Arts & Crafts, Performing Arts, Visual Arts or Self-Determined - Expressive Arts project areas. Project enrollment requirements are listed under each class.
- All exhibits must be the result of this year's project by the exhibitor.
- Only one exhibit may be entered under each lot number.
- All entries not entered correctly will be judged and placed in the pink ribbon group.

### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Duplicate items made by an exhibitor may not be exhibited under more than one lot number
- All articles should be in an appropriate finished form: mounted, matted, hemmed, etc. Framing is optional
- A framed article must be wired for hanging
- Drawings, paintings and other hanging displays may be stapled if there is no other way of hanging them
- If a project is made of several different components (example: glass, paint and fabric) it must be listed under the lot number that comprises the majority of the item
- Very small items must be secured in a small box, clear baggie or on a display/tray of appropriate size
- Coloring book pictures or paint by number items are not allowed in this department
- **Posters, scrapbooks and display exhibits:** Exhibitors must follow all requirements located in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'
- **Electronic media exhibits:** Exhibitors must follow all requirements located in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'
- **Definitions:**
  - **'Original design':** a project where the exhibitor did not use a purchased design to complete the project. Pre-cut pieces purchased in separate quantities (example: frame, yarn, backing, thread) and combined into a project are considered as original design
  - **'Kit':** a project where the exhibitor purchased a design and materials in pre-packaged form and assembled the pieces into a project. Kits that are entered must be labeled as such on a 3" x 5" index card that is attached to the entry tag.

### **CLASS A – WRITTEN, SPOKEN AND VISUAL COMMUNICATIONS**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Creative Writing or Performing Arts project.**

**REQUIREMENTS:** Electronic media entries, posters, scrapbooks and displays must conform to all requirements listed in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

**Lot Numbers:**

1. A collection of two or more items that document how you planned your speech. These could include a speech planning worksheet, list of references, speech outline, note cards, etc.
2. Poster of stress reduction tips and suggestions for dealing with speech anxiety
3. A video of you practicing your speech, with a short note describing what you noticed when you watched the video. Make sure to read all requirements located in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors' about electronic media entries
4. Poster, display or journal about the things you discovered from a person you interviewed
5. A report, essay or journal about a person you interviewed
6. Poster or display that illustrates things families can do together instead of watching television
7. A journal or log about books you have read. Include notes about each book
8. A reading journal about a book you read
9. A family scrapbook of a special event, birthday, holiday, or any other family event that was created by you and two or more family members
10. A handwritten "commonplace book"
11. Scrapbook of original poetry
12. Poster or display about proper e-mail or text messaging "etiquette"
13. A personal essay about why you keep a journal or diary
  - **NOTE:** journals and diaries should not be entered in the Fair
14. Any other piece of original creative writing (poem, short story, essay or play)

Self-determined project exhibits are records of projects not listed in the premium list or an expansion of a traditional project beyond limits of the project or in greater depth than the project outlines.

**REQUIREMENTS:** Electronic media entries, posters, scrapbooks and displays must conform to all requirements listed in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

**Lot Numbers:**

1. A poster promoting your self-determined project
2. An article made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card attached identifying resources. The article should be of reasonable size to exhibit in the Expo building
3. A collection made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card identifying work done
4. A scrapbook with story or essay, drawings, and photos of project work done during the current enrollment year
5. Any other self-determined project not listed above
