### ADDITIONAL RULES OF ENTRY

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in a 4H, FFA, or other approved youth group carrying a similar supervised program in Veterinary Science, Animal or Self-Determined - Animal Science project areas. Project enrollment requirements are listed under each class.
- All exhibits must be the result of this year's project by the exhibitor.
- Only one exhibit may be entered under each lot number.
- All entries not entered correctly will be judged and placed in the pink ribbon group.

### REQUIREMENTS:

- All entries must identify the species specific to each individual entry (if applicable)
- **Posters, scrapbooks and display exhibits:** Exhibitors must follow all requirements located in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'
- **Electronic media exhibits:** Exhibitors must follow all requirements located in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

### CLASS A – VETERINARY SCIENCE

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in *any* animal project or a Veterinary Science project.

#### Lot Numbers:

1. Poster or display showing the internal structure of a domestic animal with major organs identified
2. Poster or display showing the external structure of a domestic animal with major parts identified
3. Poster with information on housing, feed and maintenance for good health of an animal
4. 3D Display of the skeletal system – identify species
5. 3D Display of the muscular system – identify species
6. 3D Display of the organ system – identify species
7. Poster on an immunization schedule for a selected animal species
8. Poster showing 5 types of bacteria common to a selected animal species
9. Poster showing the life cycle of a parasite that infects a selected animal species
10. Scrapbook showing the steps necessary to raise a healthy animal from birth to maturity
11. Poster or display of some poisonous plants to a selected animal species
12. Poster illustrating four or more breeds of any animal
13. Poster or scrapbook of the history/development of a particular breed
14. Poster showing 5 types of diseases that are common to a selected animal species
15. Poster showing 3 types of injuries that are common to a selected animal species and what can be done to prevent them
16. Poster or scrapbook on different careers within veterinary science and the education required for each
17. Scrapbook to include project record of member's work in the Veterinary Science Project this year
18. Written report (2 pages maximum) describing the factors to consider before getting a pet

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19. Any other exhibit not mentioned above directly related to veterinary science

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a listed species animal project or a Veterinary Science project.**

**REQUIREMENTS:** All entries must be specific to the species of the Class which they are entered under.

**Lot Numbers:**

1. Poster on safety or handling techniques
2. Poster or scrapbook on judging standards for your species or a specific breed within your species
3. Poster, scrapbook or display identifying breeds within a species
4. Poster or display showing the internal structure of species with major organs identified
5. Poster or display showing the external structure of species with major parts identified
6. Scrapbook or report showcasing your work in your animal project this year
7. Poster or scrapbook showcasing your experience during one of the Educational Point activities  
Must contain a minimum of four (4) 4" x 6" photos with captions if a poster
8. Poster or display comparing three (3) different feed rations
9. Poster on cuts of meat (if applicable)
10. Poster identifying the tools used for grooming and how they are used
11. Poster, scrapbook or display showing life stages of your animal species
12. Poster or display of plants that are poisonous to your animal
13. Poster or scrapbook showing conformation faults
14. Herd management calendar
15. Poster showing an immunization schedule
16. Grooming Kit – must attach a 3" x 5" index card that identifies each item and its use
17. First Aid Kit – must attach a 3" x 5" index card that identifies each item and its use
18. Scrapbook or display that shows common diseases to your species and their treatment
19. Write a career profile or business plan for business related to your species
20. Display of a species-specific shelter that you designed
21. Any other exhibit not mentioned above directly related to education about your specific species

**CLASS J – DOG EDUCATION / DOGLESS DOG**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Dog or Veterinary Science project.**

**Lot Numbers:**

1. Poster or display on the external parts of a dog
2. Poster or display on the internal parts of a dog
3. Poster of 5 different dog breeds, noting each breed's characteristics
4. Set of self-made flash cards with at least 20 breeds of dogs
5. Scrapbook or poster that tells a story about a dog you own. Should include: requirements for feeding/watering, preventative veterinary care, grooming, daily care, memories made with your dog, favorite things about your dog, name/age/gender/breed
6. Poster, display or scrapbook about dog obedience training
7. Poster, display or scrapbook about hunting dogs
8. Poster, display or scrapbook about police dogs
9. Poster, display or scrapbook about service dog training and requirements
10. Poster or display identifying symptoms of common dog diseases and how to treat them
11. Handmade dog equipment item (collar, leash, toy, etc.)
12. Poster of dog first aid, health and/or safety
13. Poster showing the life cycle of external parasites of a dog
14. Poster showing the life cycle of internal parasites of a dog

15. Handmade article of clothing for a dog
16. Poster or display of a dog kennel building you designed
17. Poster or scrapbook showing conformation faults
18. Poster showing an immunization schedule

## **CLASS K – CAT EDUCATION / CATLESS CAT**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Cat or Veterinary Science project.**

### **Lot Numbers:**

1. Poster or display on the external parts of a cat
2. Poster or display on the internal parts of a cat
3. Poster of 5 different cat breeds, noting each breed's characteristics
4. Poster explaining different cat coat colors
5. Set of self-made flash cards with at least 20 breeds of cats
6. Scrapbook or poster that tells a story about a cat you own. Should include: requirements for feeding/watering, preventative veterinary care, grooming, daily care, memories made with your dog, favorite things about your dog, name/age/gender/breed
7. Handmade cat equipment item (collar, leash, toy, etc.)
8. Poster or display identifying symptoms of common cat diseases and how to treat them
9. Poster about cat first aid, health and/or safety
10. Poster showing the life cycle of external parasites of a cat
11. Poster showing the life cycle of internal parasites of a cat
12. Poster showing an immunization schedule
13. Poster, scrapbook or display showing life stages of a cat
14. Poster or display of plants that are poisonous to a cat
15. Cat related craft project
16. Handmade item for use in the cat project
17. Any other exhibit not mentioned above directly related to cat education

## **CLASS L – HORSE EDUCATION**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horse and Pony, Horseless Horse, or Veterinary Science project.**

**REQUIREMENTS:** Model Horse entries (Lots 1 through 6) should depict Horse Show classes. Judging will be based on correctness, appearance, appropriateness and realism.

### **Lot Numbers:**

1. Model Horse: Open costume
2. Model Horse: Trail – English/Western
3. Model Horse: Saddle seat/park pleasure
4. Model Horse: Hunter under saddle
5. Model Horse: Western pleasure
6. Model Horse: Harness driving
7. Set of self-made flash cards with at least 20 breeds of horses, ponies or other equine
8. Poster of 5 different horse breeds, noting each breed's characteristics
9. First-Aid Kit for trail riding – must attach a 3" x 5" index card that identifies each item and its use
10. Create a glossary of Equine terms
11. Poster or display of fencing samples with advantages and disadvantages of each
12. Poster or display showcasing your favorite breed

13. Poster or display showing different parts of a horse
14. Poster or scrapbook showing conformation faults
15. Poster or display of an equine skeleton with identification
16. Poster or display identifying face and/or leg markings
17. Poster or display showing equine colors and/or color patterns
18. Poster or display identifying symptoms of common equine diseases and how to treat them
19. Poster showing the life cycle of parasites of a horse
20. Poster or display identifying parts of a saddle, bridle and/or harness
21. Poster or display of a design you made of a trail class pattern
22. Poster or display of a design you made of a complete showmanship pattern
23. Poster, scrapbook or display of steps to planning a horse camping experience or showcasing a horse camping experience you were a part of
24. Write a career profile or business plan for a horse related business
25. Poster or display of a horse stable facility that you designed
26. Any other exhibit not mentioned above directly related to horse education

### **CLASS M – ADVENTURES IN DAIRYLAND**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Dairy or a Veterinary Science project.**

#### **Lot Numbers:**

1. Poster or display on milk and dairy products
2. Poster or display on how cows work
3. Poster or display on discovering dairy
4. Poster or display on dairy animals and man
5. Poster or display on dairy breeds
6. Any other exhibit relating to dairy

### **CLASS N – SELF-DETERMINED - ANIMAL AND VETERINARY SCIENCE**

**Open to all exhibitors enrolled in *any* animal project, Veterinary Science or Self-Determined - Animal Sciences project.**

Self-determined project exhibits are records of projects not listed in the premium list or an expansion of a traditional project beyond limits of the project or in greater depth than the project outlines.

**REQUIREMENTS:** Posters, scrapbooks and displays must conform to all requirements listed in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

#### **Lot Numbers:**

1. A poster promoting your self-determined project
2. An article made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card attached identifying resources. The article should be of reasonable size to exhibit in the Expo building
3. A collection made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card identifying work done
4. A scrapbook with story or essay, drawings, and photos of project work done during the current enrollment year
5. Any other self-determined project not listed above
