- Only one exhibit may be entered under each lot number.
- All entries not entered correctly will be judged and placed in the pink ribbon group.

CLASS A – SEWING, HORSE ITEMS

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing project.

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing project.

CLASS D – SEWING, NON-CLOTHING ITEMS

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing project.

Lot Numbers:

1. Sewn article for use in home (pillow, placemat, potholder, etc.)
2. Simple carryall bag (tote bag, laundry bag, gym bag, purse, etc.)
3. Sewn dress or one-piece outfit for a baby doll (18" doll), display on doll, foam core board or hanger
4. Sewn dress or one-piece outfit for a fashion doll (11" doll), display on doll, foam core board or hanger
5. Sewn multi-piece outfit for a baby doll (18" doll), must consist of 3 or more pieces, display on doll, foam core board or hanger
6. Sewn multi-piece outfit for a fashion doll (11" doll), must consist of 3 or more pieces, display on doll, foam core board or hanger

7. Any sewn holiday item
8. Stuffed animal
9. Decorative throw pillow
10. Any other sewn item - non wearable

CLASS E – QUILTING

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing project.

SIZE GUIDELINES FOR CLASS E:

- **Lap Cover:** Approximate size of 45" x 45"
- **Baby Quilt:** Approximate size of 36" x 52"
- **Throw:** Approximate size of 50" x 65"
- **Bed Quilt, Small:** Approximate size of 72" x 90"
- **Bed Quilt, Large:** Approximate size of 85" x 108" or larger

CLASS F – CONSUMER SAVVY

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing or Consumer Savvy project.

Lot Numbers:

1. An exhibit of 5 items (clothing and accessories) that coordinate into 1 outfit. Items may be purchased. Attach a 3" x 5" index card explaining cost and use.
2. An exhibit of 5 items that showcase a selection of ready-to-wear clothing articles. Items may be purchased. Attach a 3" x 5" index card explaining cost and use.
3. Poster, display or scrapbook: "Putting on the Ritz". Plan and describe what you'd wear for a special occasion, wedding, prom, family portrait, etc.
4. Poster or display on reading clothing labels, (what to look for on labels for proper care, sustainably/responsibly made, natural or synthetic materials, etc.)
5. Poster, display or scrapbook of a weekly outfit planner
6. Poster, display or scrapbook: "Shopping Spree!". Coordinate a minimum of 5 outfits you would love to own if money was no object. Include 5 items in each outfit (clothing, shoes and/or accessories). List the cost of each item and the brand.

CLASS G - SELF-DETERMINED - CLOTHING

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Sewing project.

Self-determined project exhibits are records of projects not listed in the premium list or an expansion of a traditional project beyond limits of the project or in greater depth than the project outlines.

REQUIREMENTS: Posters, scrapbooks and displays must conform to all requirements listed in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

Lot Numbers:

1. A poster promoting your self-determined project
2. An article made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card attached identifying resources. The article should be of reasonable size to exhibit in the Expo building
3. A collection made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card identifying work done
4. A scrapbook with story or essay, drawings, and photos of project work done during the current enrollment year
5. Any other self-determined project not listed above
