

ADDITIONAL RULES OF ENTRY

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in a 4H, FFA, or other approved youth group carrying a similar supervised program in Horticulture & Gardening or Self-Determined - Plant and Soil Sciences project areas. Project enrollment requirements are listed under each class.
- All entries must be the result of this year's project by the exhibitor.
- Only one exhibit may be entered under each lot number.
- All entries not entered correctly will be judged and placed in the pink ribbon group.

REQUIREMENTS:

- All produce exhibited must be from the current year's crop and from the exhibitor's own or family garden
- The number of specimens to be exhibited is in parenthesis behind each lot description
- Vegetable exhibitors are limited to listing no more than 10 vegetables on the fair entry form, plus one Garden Box entry
- Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified
- Fruits and vegetables need to be cleaned but not washed

CLASS A – VEGETABLES

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

REQUIREMENTS: Include a 3" x 5" index card of the variety name with the entry if 'labeled' is listed as a requirement of the entry

CLASS B – FRUITS

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

REQUIREMENTS: Include a 3" x 5" index card of the variety name with the entry

Lot Numbers:

1. Pears, any variety, correctly labeled - (6)
2. Peaches, any variety, correctly labeled - (6)
3. Plums, any variety, correctly labeled - (12)
4. Nuts, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
5. Grapes, any variety, correctly labeled - 1 bunch
6. Blueberries, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
7. Raspberries, any variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
8. Blackberries, any domesticated variety, correctly labeled - ½ pint
9. Any other fruit (non-apple), correctly labeled (large fruit - 6 each; small fruit - ½ pint)

CLASS C – HERBS

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

REQUIREMENTS:

- **Individual Herb Entries (Lots 1-12):** Must include (6) sprigs (leaves & stems) in a plastic bag, no roots
- **Herb Display Entry (Lot 13):** Must include (6) sprigs (leaves & stems) of any three (3) varieties of herbs, no roots, each herb variety must be tied in a bunch
- Include a 3" x 5" index card of the variety name with the entry if 'labeled' is listed as a requirement of the entry

REQUIREMENTS: All entries in this class must contain five (5) specimens. Crab apple varieties must contain eight (8) specimens

CLASS F – APPLE VARIETY

REQUIREMENTS:

- All entries in this class must contain one (1) apple type/color with (5) different varieties.
- Entry must include a 3" x 5" index card with the variety names listed

Lot Numbers:

1. Red Apples, identify five (5) different varieties within the exhibit
2. Green or Yellow Apples, identify five (5) different varieties within the exhibit

CLASS G – GARDEN BOX

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

Entries will consist of a collection of vegetable varieties from the following list:

Lot Numbers:

1. Junior Garden Box (Grades 3-6 as of January 1st) - Must contain any four (4) varieties
2. Intermediate Garden Box (Grades 7-8 as of January 1st) - Must contain any five (5) varieties
3. Senior Garden Box (Grades 9 and older as of January 1st) - Must contain any six (6) varieties

CLASS H - LARGEST VEGETABLE

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

Premium - \$5.00, one prize per lot

The largest exhibit in each entry will be determined by weight, unless noted.

CLASS I - VEGETABLE SCULPTURE

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening project.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Only plant material may be used to create exhibit. No artificial or non-organic materials
- Toothpicks are allowed for building/stabilization purposes only
- Item must be three dimensional
- Exhibit may represent a human, animal or inanimate objects (airplane, tractor, robot, etc.)

Lot Numbers:

1. Small exhibit: less than 8" at the widest and/or tallest point
2. Large exhibit: more than 8", but less than 16" at the widest and/or tallest point

CLASS J - SELF-DETERMINED - HORTICULTURE & GARDENING

Open to all exhibitors enrolled in a Horticulture & Gardening or Self-Determined - Plant and Soil Sciences project.

Self-determined project exhibits are records of projects not listed in the premium list or an expansion of a traditional project beyond limits of the project or in greater depth than the project outlines.

REQUIREMENTS: Posters, scrapbooks and displays must conform to all requirements listed in 'General Rules for Junior Division Exhibitors'

Lot Numbers:

1. A poster promoting your self-determined project
2. An article made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card attached identifying resources. The article should be of reasonable size to exhibit in the Expo building
3. A collection made during current year with a 3" x 5" index card identifying work done
4. A scrapbook with story or essay, drawings, and photos of project work done during the current enrollment year
5. Any other self-determined project not listed above
